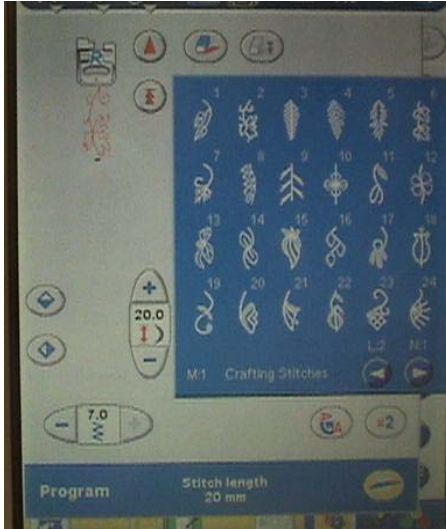


Decorative Stitches used in the hoop on the DSE

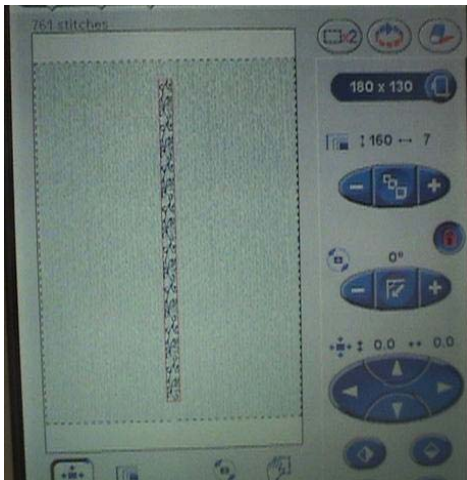

Attach the embroidery unit and once it's calibrated, choose the 130 X 180 hoop size. (You can use any hoop size you want. I'm just using this as an example.)

Choose the M menu and stitch #1. Notice the stitch length is 20. We know that we can fit almost 180mm of space but let's not push it. $180 \text{ Divided by } 20 = 9$. So, let's say we want 8 of those stitches to make sure that the foot doesn't hit the hoop at the top or the bottom.



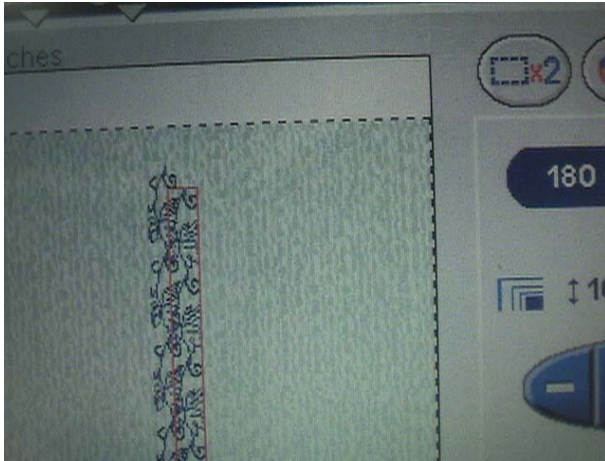
Touch that X2 icon at the bottom right side 7 times to make a set of 8 repeats of those stitches. Touch the yellow icon below that to close the screen and this is what you will see. The outline box is around all of them designating that it is now ONE design.



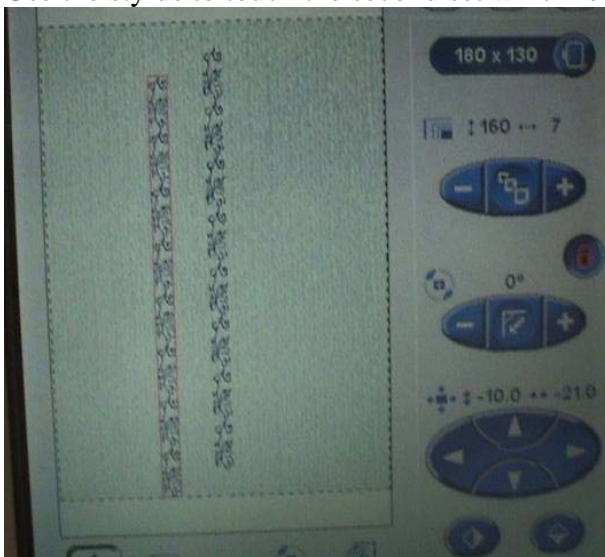
Notice the 4 "Positioning arrows". Notice the numbers above are 0.0 and 0.0. The design is centered vertically and horizontally. **The one pointing up will make all of those combined stitches move upward.** The left one moves them to the left and the right to the right and of course the down arrow moves them down. I want them to be right where

they are.

But what if we wanted another row of them on the left side. Touch the icon at the top right that looks like a rectangle with 2 by it. That will repeat the design and if we touch the side to side mirror, it will flip it over to mirror the other line.



Use the stylus to touch the second set which is outlined (selected) and move it to the left.



But we want them lined up even at the top, right? Notice that mine says 10.0 right now and it's slightly below the first line. So, touch the up arrow to move it until that figure says 0.0. If you want them wider apart, then touch the left arrow to move it straight over.

You could use the “rotate _ or +” (oval icon above) to angle those lines if you wanted to. If you touch the arrow in the center, it will rotate those stitches 90 degrees to horizontal. You could add more deco stitches in the center if you wanted to.
